2023 Nashville Emerging Leader Awards Finalists Announced

Sixteenth Annual Celebration will showcase Nashville's Young Professionals

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (June 2, 2023) – The Nashville Area Chamber of Commerce and YP Nashville announced today the 2023 finalists for the Nashville Emerging Leader Awards (NELA). NELA recognizes Middle Tennessee's young professionals under the age of 40 for significant accomplishments in their chosen career field, as well as their commitment and contribution to the community.

"Talented emerging leaders across the nation recognize the value of Nashville's young professional ecosystem and the impact they have on our region's growth and economy," said Ralph Schulz, President and CEO of the Nashville Area Chamber of Commerce. "Through YP Nashville, we are able to recognize and celebrate these 56 emerging leaders whose passion and dedication move our region forward."

NELA recognizes up to four finalists and one winner in 14 industry categories: Architecture, Engineering and Construction; Arts, Entertainment and Music Business; Community Service and Nonprofit; Education; Environment and Sustainability; Finance; Government and Public Affairs; Hospitality and Tourism; Human Resources; Legal Services; Medical and Healthcare Services; Public Relations, Advertising and Marketing; Real Estate Services; and Technology.

Judges of each industry category are leaders in their respective field who review applications and select the finalists and winner based on each applicant's answers to essay questions, level of professional achievement, demonstrated leadership and community impact.

NELA winners will be announced during the <u>NELA Ceremony</u> at the Renaissance Hotel on Wednesday, July 12, at 6:00 p.m. with a reception immediately following. YP Nashville is presented by Belmont University, Jack C. Massey College of Business, and the Center for Executive Education. The awards are supported by Atiba, Lightning 100, and the Nashville Post.
